 <p><b>Textiles</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Hosen</li> <li>• Underwear</li> <li>• Shoes, etc.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clog the pumps and damage machines in the sewage treatment plant</li> </ul>	Not wearable: <b>Bin for residual waste</b>  Wearable: <b>Used clothing collection</b>
 <p><b>Problem materials and poisons:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Medications</li> <li>• Herbicides</li> <li>• Pesticides</li> <li>• Disinfectants</li> <li>• Drain cleaners</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Worsens the cleaning performance of the sewage treatment plants</li> <li>• Hazardous materials get into water intact</li> <li>• Pollute the environment</li> </ul>	<b>Hazardous materials collection centre / recycling centre</b>
 <p><b>Extraneous materials and oxidizing substances:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paints/lacquers</li> <li>• Cement/mortar/building waste</li> <li>• Mineral oils</li> <li>• Acids and lyes</li> <li>• Chemicals</li> <li>• Accumulators/batteries</li> <li>• Solvents</li> <li>• Detergents &amp; cleaning agents</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Form stubborn residues</li> <li>• Disturbs the waste water purification</li> <li>• Break down only with difficulty</li> <li>• Pollute the environment</li> </ul> <p><b>TIP:</b> In the case of detergents make sure they are bio-degradable!</p>	<b>Hazardous materials collection centre / recycling centre</b>
 <p><b>Food wastes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Waste from meals</li> <li>• Food oils, cooking oil</li> <li>• Spoiled foods</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Give rats more nutrition</li> <li>• Adhere and clog sewer lines</li> </ul>	Food wastes: <b>organic waste bin, compost</b>  Food oils/cooking oils: <b>FATTY / OIL</b> <b>Hazardous materials collection centre / recycling centre</b>
 <p><b>Sharp objects:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Razor blades</li> <li>• Syringes</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Endanger employees of sewage treatment plants and sewer operations</li> </ul>	Separately in puncture-proof containers <b>Hazardous materials collection centre / recycling centre</b>
 <p><b>Other:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cat litter</li> <li>• Cigarette butts</li> <li>• Small animal wastes</li> <li>• Animal cadaver</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Clogged sewers</li> <li>• Cause unpleasant odours</li> <li>• Expensive to remove in the sewage treatment plant</li> <li>• Causes increased costs</li> </ul>	<b>Bin for residual waste</b>  Animal cadaver: <b>Animal cadaver collection site</b>
